Titling Guidelines

About Outdoor Dog

Outdoor Dog is a fun titling venue that encourages people to get outside with their canine partner(s) by submitting activity logs. Any person or dog (who meets the canine age requirement) can participate as long as one can do so safely. Titling opportunities currently include: Backpacking Barker, Canine Camper, Furry Floater, Hiking Hound, Letterboxing Pup, Paddling Pup, Sailing Seadog, and Wagging Walker.

Outdoor Dog Title Categories

Outdoor Dog currently offers eight different title categories. The Wagging Walker titles are for people who enjoy walking with their dog(s) on flat paths, trails, or on sidewalks. The Hiking Hound titles were created for people who love to hike with their dog(s) in wooded areas on non-flat trails. Dogs can also earn titles for backpacking with Backpacking Barkers. Letterboxing fans can enjoy the Letterboxing Pup titles.

Outdoor Dog also offers titling in water recreation. Furry Floater titles are offered for swimming. Also, the Paddling Pup titles are for participants who kayak, canoe, or paddle board with their dog(s) while the Sailing Seadog is for boaters or sailors.

Lastly, Outdoor Dog offers Canine Camper titles for those who enjoy spending the night in the great outdoors with their dog(s). Each title is earned by the dog rather than the person and dog team. Therefore, every member of the household can participate in earning titles for the dog.

Outdoor Dog Title Tracks

Each Outdoor Dog title, except for Letterboxing Pup, has two different tracks to provide more opportunities for people to participate. The location track encourages participants to find various locations to hike, walk, kayak, boat, sail, or camp with their dog(s). The second track allows for participants to track their distance, hours, number of nights, or number of outings for an activity. The distance and hours requirements have been calculated based on a 2 mile an hour pace.

Each track has a separate title. Therefore, someone can earn a location title as well as a distance/hour title. *However, an outing can only be counted towards one title and title track.* For example, a hike for letterboxing cannot be used towards the Letterboxing Pup title and the Hiking Hound title. Additionally, the same hike cannot be used for the Distance/Hours track and the Trails track. If a participant has multiple dogs, an outing can be counted towards both dogs' titles if they both attend the outing. However, the participant must submit a separate log for each dog.

Outdoor Dog Divisions

There are two Outdoor Dog divisions in which participants can enter. The Regular Division is for anyone between the ages of 18 years old and 64 years old.

The Delight Division is for anyone 17 years old and younger or 65 years old or older. Senior dogs who are over the age of 8 may also participate in the Delight Division. Additionally, any person or dog with a disability can participate in the Delight Division. If someone qualifies for the Delight Division but would rather enter in the Regular Division, they may do so. For questions regarding who qualifies for the Delight Division or if you need additional modifications, please email outdoordogtitling@gmail.com.

A participant can move to the Delight Division at any time, even if the dog has earned titles in the Regular Division. When a participant moves to the Delight Division, he or she may choose to start over with the dog by entering the first level in the Delight Division. Alternatively, the participant may choose to earn the next level that the dog would have been working towards in the Regular Division. For example, if the dog has earned a title in Level 4 in the Hiking Hound Trails Track, the dog and participant can complete the “difference” between Level 4 and 5 in the Delight Division. Therefore, after completing 5 more trails, the dog would be eligible to earn the Level 5 title. *Please notify Outdoor Dog via email outdoordogtitling@gmail.com when switching from the Regular Division to the Delight Division.*

Outdoor Dog Levels

There are currently six to ten levels in each title category. Each level builds on the other. For example, when a dog finishes Level 1 Hiking Hound in the Distance or Hours Track, the miles from Level 1 count towards the Level 2 title. Therefore, a dog only needs to hike 15 more miles to achieve the Level 2 Hiking Hound Distance title. The same log can then be maintained for all of the levels in that track.

Outdoor Dog Guidelines

Outdoor Dog Extreme

Outdoor Dog Extreme titles were created for participants who love a challenge! The titles have the same guidelines as the other Outdoor Dog titles but require more intense distances, hours, or number of locations. A participant can only enter Extreme when he or she has completed the highest title in a title track. For example, if Peter completes the Hiking Hound Trails Track level 7 title, he can move onto the first Hiking Hound Trails Track Extreme level 1 title. The number of trails completed in his level 7 title will count towards the Extreme level 1 title. Like in the other Outdoor Dog titles, each level builds upon the other.

Outdoor Dog Activity Log

To earn an Outdoor Dog title, an activity log must be submitted that demonstrates the title criteria has been met. One log can be maintained for a title track. Therefore, after completing a level, the participant does not need to start a new log for the dog. The Outdoor Dog logs can be utilized when recording activities. The required information for titling is noted on each log with a red asterisk. However, a participant may choose to create his or her own log, as long as it contains the required information. The Outdoor Dog logs can be found on the [Outdoor Dog website](#) and [Facebook group](#).

The following table outlines the required information to be included in the logs. Please see the specific category and title track for more information.

Outdoor Dog Guidelines

Outdoor Dog Rules

Outdoor Dog participants must be respectful and courteous of other people and the environment including animals and plants. Each participant must follow applicable laws and assumes any risk of activity. The participant is responsible for determining their own ability to participate safely as well as their dog's ability to participate safely. The participants must use proper safety equipment to keep themselves, their dog(s), and others safe.

Please consult a doctor or veterinarian when necessary to ensure safety and/or to create an appropriate exercise plan.

Due to the risk associated with certain exercises for puppies, all dogs must be 12 months old or older to participate in Backpacking Barker, Furry Floater, Hiking Hound, Letterboxing Pup, Paddling Pup, and Wagging Walker. To participate in Canine Camper or Sailing Seadog, all dogs must be 8 weeks old or older. Participants cannot log any activities before the dog is the required age. For titling specifically geared towards puppies and children, please refer to the Adventure Puppy titling program by visiting the [Outdoor Dog](#) website or the [Facebook group](#).

Submitting an Entry

To earn an Outdoor Dog title, an entry form must be submitted for each level/track with an activity log. Please complete the [entry form online](#). The dog's log must also be filled out and emailed to outdoordogtitling@gmail.com. Additionally, a \$15 payment for each track/level is required. For example, if a handler is submitting entries for OD-HD1, OD-HD2, and OD-HD3, the cost would be \$45. Payments can be submitted through PayPal to outdoordogtitling@gmail.com or completed in the [Outdoor Dog online store](#). Awards

When the dog has earned a title, awards will be mailed to the handler's provided address. For Outdoor Dog titles, participants will be able to choose from the following award options:

- 🐾 Personalized, handmade plaque with a certificate
- 🐾 Outdoor Dog ribbon with a certificate
- 🐾 Certificate only
- 🐾 Plaque, ribbon, and certificate for an additional \$5 fee per title

Images of the award options are provided on the online entry form.

For Outdoor Dog Extreme titles, awards include a personalized, handmade wooden compass and certificate. Please allow up to 8 weeks for delivery due to the time needed to make each award.

Outdoor Dog Titles

Backpacking Barker

The Backpacking Barker titles are for participants who enjoy backpacking with their dog(s). To receive a title, the dog must wear a canine backpack for at least 75% of the time spent walking or hiking. Additionally, because of each dog’s unique needs, there is no requirement concerning the contents or weight of the pack. The handler does not need to wear a backpack. A participant can earn titles in two different tracks. An outing can only count towards one track.

Backpacking Trails Track

The Backpacking Trails Track allows participants to log different trails in order to earn titles. In the Backpacking Trails Track, a Regular Division participant be with his or her dog(s) hiking on the trail for at least 30 minutes to be counted towards a title. For the Delight Division, the participant must be with his or her dog(s) hiking on the trail for at least 15 minutes to be counted towards a title. There is no distance or pace requirement for either division. The trail does not need to be completed start to finish to be counted.

To earn a title in the Backpacking Trails Track, the log must include the date the hike or walk took place and the name of the trail. If there is no trail name or hiking occurred without a trail, the location hiked can be used such as a town name, park name, or state game lands number.

If there are any questions about what constitutes as one trail as in situations like the Appalachian Trail where a trail covers a large area, please email outdoordogtitling@gmail.com.

Distance or Hours Track

The Distance or Hours Track allows participants to log *either* the distance backpacked or the hours spent backpacking. The participant does not need to enter both. However, the participant must choose either hours or miles/kilometers to use throughout the log. The participant cannot use a combination of hours *and* miles/kilometers to earn a title. The distance or hours can be completed at the same location. There are no minimum time requirements for the distance or hours track.

To earn a title in the Distance or Hours Track, the log must include the date that the backpacking took place. Additionally, the hours spent backpacking *or* the miles/kilometers backpacked must be recorded.

Canine Camper

The Canine Camper titles are for participants who enjoy camping with their dog(s) in tents, pop-ups, campers, RVs, or cabins. A participant can earn titles in two different tracks. An outing can only count towards one track.

Campgrounds Track

The Campgrounds Track allows participants to log different locations where they camp. The location does not need to specifically be a campground. The participant must spend one night in the camping location to be counted towards a title in both divisions.

To earn a title in the Campgrounds Track, the log must include the start date of the camping trip. This is the first day the participant and dog(s) spend the night at the campground. Additionally, the log must include the campground name. If the participant is staying in a location without a name, another name can be used such as a park or town name.

Outdoor Dog Guidelines

Nights Track

The Nights Track allows participants to log the number of nights spent camping with their dog(s). The number of nights can be completed at the same location. There is no minimum number of nights for the Nights Track. To earn a title in the Nights Track, the log must include the start date of the camping trip. This is the day the participant and dog(s) arrive at the campground. Additionally, the log must include the number of nights spent at the campground.

Furry Floater

The Furry Floater titles are for dogs who love to swim and/or play in water. A participant can earn titles in two different tracks. An outing can only count towards one track.

Locations Track

The Locations Track allows participants to log different locations where they take their dog(s) swimming. A Regular Division dog must play in the water for at least 10 minutes for the location to be counted towards a title. For the Delight Division, the dog must play in the water for at least 5 minutes for the location to be counted towards a title. However, the dog does not need to spend the whole time actively swimming. The dog can swim, play, retrieve, and wade in the water during the outing.

To earn a title in the Locations Track, the log must include the date of the activity and the location name such as the town or body of water.

Outdoor Dog Guidelines

Hours Track

The Hours Track allows participants to log the hours spent swimming. The hours can be completed at the same location. There are no minimum time requirements for the Hours Track. Additionally, the dog does not have to be actively swimming for the duration of the outing. The time logged can include swimming, playing, retrieving, and wading in the water.

To earn a title in the Hours Track, the log must include the date of the activity as well as the number of hours spent swimming or playing in the water.

Hiking Hound

The Hiking Hound titles are for participants who enjoy hiking with their dog(s) on wooded trails that are not flat. A participant can earn titles in two different tracks. An outing can only count towards one track.

Hiking Trails Track

The Hiking Trails Track allows participants to log different hiking trails in order to earn titles. In the Hiking Trails Track, a Regular Division participant be with his or her dog(s) hiking on the trail for at least 30 minutes to be counted towards a title. For the Delight Division, the participant must be with his or her dog(s) hiking on the trail for at least 15 minutes to be counted towards a title. There is no distance or pace requirement for either division. The trail does not need to be completed start to finish to be counted.

To earn a title in the Hiking Trails Track, the log must include the date the hike took place and the name of the trail. If there is no trail name or hiking occurred without a trail, the location hiked can be used such as a town name, park name, or state game lands number.

Distance or Hours Track

The Distance or Hours Track allows participants to log *either* the distance hiked or the hours spent hiking. The participant does not need to enter both. However, the participant must choose either hours or miles/kilometers to use throughout the log. The participant cannot use a combination of hours *and* miles/kilometers to earn a title. The distance or hours can completed be at the same location. There are no minimum time requirements for the Distance or Hours Track.

To earn a title in the Distance or Hours Track, the log must include the date that the hike took place. Additionally, the hours spent hiking *or* the miles/kilometers hiked must be recorded.

Letterboxing Pup

The Letterboxing Pup titles are for participants who enjoy letterboxing with their dog(s). A participant can earn titles in one track.

Letterboxes Track

The Letterboxes Track allows participants to log different letterboxes they find in order to earn titles. In the Letterboxes Track, a Regular Division or Delight Division participant must find a letterbox in order for the outing to be counted towards the letterboxing title. There are no time or distance requirements for either division.

To earn a title in the Letterboxes Track, the log must include the date the letterbox was found and the name of the letterbox or letterbox location such as a town or park name.

Paddling Pup

The Paddling Pup titles are for participants who enjoy kayaking, canoeing, or row boating with their dog(s). The title is for any non-motorized watercraft that require a person to use a paddle, oars, or peddles to move the watercraft through the water. A participant can earn titles in two different tracks. An outing can only count towards one track.

Boat Launches Track

The Boat Launches Track allows participants to log different locations where they enter the water at. Extreme Paddling Pup

The Paddling Pup titles are for participants who enjoy kayaking, canoeing, or row boating with their dog(s). The title is for any non-motorized watercraft that require a person to use a paddle, oars, or peddles to move the watercraft through the water. A participant can earn titles in two different tracks. An outing can only count towards one track.

Extreme Boat Launches Track

The Boat Launches Track allows participants to log different locations where they enter the water at. For example, Raystown Lake has multiple boat launches such as Seven Points, Weaver Falls, and Shy Beaver. Each launch can be considered at different location even though it is at the same lake. A Regular Division participant must kayak or canoe with his or her dog(s) for at least 30 minutes for the launch to be counted towards a title. For the Delight Division, the participant must kayak or canoe with his or her dog(s) for at least 15 minutes for the launch to be counted towards a title. There are no distance or pace requirements for either division.

To earn a title in the Boat Launches Track, the log must include the date of the activity and the boat launch name. If the boat launch does not have a name, the name of the town or the body of water can be used.

To earn a title in the Locations Track, the log must include the date of the activity as well as the name of the body of water. If there is not a name, another name can be used such as a park or town name.
